#### LGiS - Key Operating Criteria

Loan Value - Minimum	1 mill SYP
Loan Value - Maximum	26 mill SYP
Guarantee - % of loan	≤ 50%
Entrepreneur- equity contribution to project	30% - 50%
Fee rate	0.75%
Highest budgeted acceptable default rate	2%
Capacity Multiplier	1.0 to 10

#### Loan Guarantee Institution

#### Benefits of a LGI in Syria

- Availability of loan finance will be increased for low collateral but viable projects SMEs
- Banks will become more pro-active as competition increases
- · Credit assessment skills to improve

#### Loan Guarantee Institution

#### Socio - Economic Benefits

- SMEs to become more globally competitive
- Employment level to increase (guarantee approvals to be linked to additional employees)
- More economic players for the Syrian economic development
- · Greater economic activity = Higher tax revenues
